Queen of 25th Street: The Rise and Fall of Rose Davie

On Ogden's 25th Street—the city's "Two-Bit Street," once lined with gambling halls, speakeasies, and brothels—few names loomed larger than Rose Davie. Known for her pink Cadillac, her pet ocelot named Gata, and her talent for staying one step ahead of the law, Rose ran one of Utah's most infamous vice empires in the mid-20th century.

From Ada to Rose

Born Ada ArZella Beveridge in 1918, Rose moved with her family to Utah during the 1920s. Alongside her sister, Birdena "Birdie" Jackie, she found her way onto 25th Street, where opportunity often came dressed in vice.

Her love life was as tumultuous as her career. She married three times—first to burglar and drug addict Chester Shaw Frost in 1941 (a union that lasted four months), then to Michael Seaman in 1945 (annulled when his other wife surfaced), and finally to William "Bill" Snede Davie in 1947, a bootlegger and gambler who became her partner in crime

The Rose Rooms

That same year, Rose signed a fiveyear lease on the second floor of 205 25th Street. At first it was a respectable rooming house. Within a year, it was transformed into the Rose Rooms, a high-dollar brothel that quickly became notorious.

The operation was slick. Rooms were wired with listening devices so Rose could monitor both her employees and their customers—making sure the men didn't get rough and the women stayed on task. Taxi drivers were paid a dollar

for every man they delivered to her door. Inside, the girls charged between \$5 and \$40, depending on looks and services. The business pulled in between \$20,000 and \$30,000 a month, a fortune in postwar Ogden.

But Rose wasn't just running a house of prostitution—she was also dealing in narcotics. Undercover officers purchased opium, morphine, and even bichloride of mercury through her connections, supplied by a local doctor.

Raids, Scandals, and Arrests

Police raids were a constant threat, but Rose seemed unshakable. In 1948, her name splashed across headlines after a Weber Wildlife Federation party spiraled out of control. Three strippers handed out matchbooks advertising the Rose Rooms, men began hurling bottles, and the police were called in. The scandal cost Rose her business license, but she carried on anyway.

In 1949, a court issued an injunction shutting down the Rose Rooms. Rose and Bill claimed they never got the notice and simply kept the doors open. By then, the couple were also acting as police informants, making them both valuable and untouchable—at least for a while.

The law eventually caught up. Rose was arrested in Farmington at her Benevolent Hand Friendship Club with \$483 in cash, a pistol, and a well-worn address book. In 1950, she and Bill were arrested multiple times at both the Rose Rooms and their other establishments. She was sentenced to a year in jail for Farmington, another year for the Rose Rooms, and later two and a half years for brothel and narcotics charges. Because of her poor health, she was allowed outside prison walls to walk the grounds—where, according to whispers, she kept

entertaining clients. Then came the tax man. In 1953, Rose was shipped off to West Virginia on federal tax evasion charges.

The Queen of Pink

Despite her stints in prison, Rose lived large. She loved the color pink so much that local shopkeepers would call her when new items arrived. She dressed head-to-toe in the shade, drove a pink Cadillac, and decorated her clubs in flashy jungle prints. Alongside Bill, she operated the Key Club, Club Zebra, and other hotspots where gambling, liquor, and prostitution thrived behind barred doors and peepholes.

Rose's reputation as a flamboyant, sharp-witted madam only grew. She was part underworld boss, part folk anti-hero, and all scandal.

The End of an Era

By the late 1950s, the Davie empire crumbled under constant legal pressure. Rose and Bill moved to Las Vegas in 1958, trading Ogden's 25th Street for the Strip. Their marriage eventually collapsed, and they divorced in 1976. Rose died in Mexico in 1980, while Bill passed away in the Bay Area two years later.

Yet their legend—especially Rose's—still haunts Ogden. The Rose Rooms are long gone, but tales of the pink Cadillac, the bugged bedrooms, and the ocelot on a leash remain woven into the lore of 25th Street's wildest years.

CGDENE NEW DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

OGDEN'S STOCKYARD EXCHANGE BUILDING UPDATE



Historical Significance

Constructed in 1930–31 by architect Leslie S. Hodgson (famous for Ogden High School and other local icons), the building served as the administrative hub for the bustling Ogden Union Stockyards—once fourth-largest in the Intermountain West

The stockyards operated from roughly 1916 to 1971, handling upwards of 1.5 million head of livestock in its heyday

Architecturally, the building features brickclad reinforced concrete, art deco pilasters, geometric-fluted cast stone livestock heads, a central arched entryway, and symmetrical sash-windowed wings

Interiors once showcased marble floors, geometric ceiling molding, dark wood moldings, original doors, and offices with transom windows; later tenants included government agencies, a trade school, a methadone clinic, and even a haunted house attraction in the 1980s

Current Condition & Risk

Ogden City acquired the building in 2013, but deterioration has accelerated due to prolonged neglect—leading to frequent vandalism, boarding of windows, and structural weather damage, notably at the northwest corner

In 2025, Preservation Utah placed it on their Most Endangered list, warning of "demolition by neglect" unless plans move fo

While the building's bones remain salvageable, the city has not yet identified a viable development path or secured a committed developer

Redevelopment Plans & Challenges From 2020 to 2024, Ogden City has been transforming the former stockyard site into the Ogden Business Exchange (OBE)—a 51-acre mixed-use lifestyle park featuring new Class-A office buildings, outdoor industry tenants (ENVE Composites, Roosters Brewing, Ogden's Own Distillery), infra-



structure upgrades, and stormwater systems developed in concert with environmental regulators and Weber State University history students.

The Exchange Building is intended to be the centerpiece of this redevelopment, potentially housing offices, café, interpretive historical displays, or community space

In 2022, a developer agreement with Denver-based Q Factor was proposed: selling 1.81 acres for \$195,000 plus up to \$800,000 in capital-improvement incentives for stabilization work. However, the deal ultimately stalled, partly due to regulatory hurdles and financial feasibility

Proposed Zoning amendments to the Business Exchange-Historic (BEH) zone would allow a developer height flexibility (45□ front / 60□ rear) to facilitate modern additions, but raised city council concerns over overshadowing and uneven exceptions

As of mid-2025, no successful proposals have materialized, though the city has allocated funds for minimal measures to "dry-in" the structure and curb further collapse if no developer can be found

Architectural & Cultural Importance
The building is a rare and well-preserved
Art-Deco agricultural landmark in Utah—
stylish yet functional, reflecting an era when
Ogden was a logistical livestock powerhouse

Its interior and exterior retain much original fabric, making it suitable for preservation and adaptive reuse without losing character

What's Next?

Ogden City may launch another Request for Proposals (RFP) or open another round of solicitation to attract a restoration-minded developer.

Local organizations and individuals are encouraged to voice support, submit preservation-based proposals, or share the building's significance to raise awareness. Creative reuse that blends history with community benefit is especially welcome

Vote 2025

The 2025 General Election for Utah is coming up on Tuesday, November 4th. While some people may have already researched and decided how they are going to vote, there may be just as many who remain undecided. Many factors can make wanting to vote feel difficult. Common factors include not knowing how to register, feeling uninformed on the issues, uncertainty of deadlines, and more. It is important to understand what candidates stand for on certain issues, as well as what initiatives may be on a ballot measure. The outcomes of each election affect the lives of everyone across the county and state.

Vote411.org is a website run by the League of Women Voters. You can register to vote, get personalized voting information such as registration status and local polling locations, search voting information by state, and make a voting plan. This information is on the homepage. Creating a personalized voter information page requires an address. The next page displays upcoming elections, such as the General Election in November. The online and by mail registration deadline is October 24th. The in-person deadline is November 4th.

The races that are displayed in the voters' guide are based on the address entered. Here, you will find a list of all the races you are eligible to vote for, regardless of if it is nationwide, statewide, or countywide. Selecting a race will provide specific information about candidates, such as links to their campaign websites. These links are where candidates post their stances on issues relevant to their candidacy. The League of Women Voters has asked candidates questions about issues they are addressing. Some of the candidates have answered those questions.

Another other important part of the personal voter information is the Utah Poll Locator. When elections come closer, this map system will show you the closest places to find either a polling location or a ballot drop box. Beneath the map is a list of recordings relevant to your voting eligibility. Finally, there are additional resources containing additional information at the bottom of the page. Any problems or concerns about any election may be reported to the number on Vote411. org's homepage.



While Vote411.org is a great location for information about voting, a vital component of research is viewing information from multiple credible sources. Credible sources hold significant importance beyond research papers; in the context of voting, they form the bedrock of trust upon which well-informed voters can base their decisions. A few more great websites for local and state voting information are weberelections.gov, https:// www.weberpl.lib.ut.us/voter-information, and vote.utah. gov. These four websites are all credible sources to search for any information necessary to be an informed voter. They are operated either by the government or a nonpartisan voting organization.

OGDEN NATURE CENTER



Fifty years ago, in 1975, a group of visionaries including Weber State professors, residents of cities throughout Weber County, and business leaders at the Defense Depot Ogden made a decision that would have an impact on future generations of Ogdenites. With a deep appreciation for the natural world, this group of men and women set aside 152 acres of land to create the Ogden Nature Center. At that time, Ogden was a quieter city, home to fewer than 70,000 people, nestled against the Wasatch Mountains with open fields and undeveloped parcels of land still common throughout the area. Few could have predicted just how vital this decision would become in the decades to follow.

Today, Ogden's population is nearing 90,000 and continues to grow. The city, like many others along the Wasatch Front, has expanded in every possible direction. Shopping centers, housing developments, and industrial complexes now occupy spaces where sagebrush and rabbitbrush once stretched unbroken across the foothills. And yet, amid this development, the Ogden Nature Center remains as a preservation of the wilderness, offering a rare refuge in an increasingly urbanized landscape.

The land is a sanctuary for wildlife, a living classroom for learners of all ages, and a reminder of what we stand to lose if we fail to protect the natural world. Stepping inside the Center feels like entering another dimension; one where the rhythm of life slows, the air smells of earth and pine, and birdsong fills the air.

Over 100 species of birds call the Ogden Nature Center home, either year-round or as migratory visitors. Great Blue Herons, those primal water-birds, wade elegantly through the water in search of fish and frogs, while American kestrels perch on branches and



observe the landscape. Songbirds flit through the trees, their calls creating a chorus that marks the passing of seasons. And if you're especially lucky, you may even glimpse a bald eagle nesting near the Picnic Grove.

But the Center is not just a home for birds. It is a sanctuary for many kinds of life. Beavers, nature's engineers, build dams and lodges in the streams, reshaping the waterways and creating habitats for other species in the process. Deer, increasingly displaced by construction and traffic, find safety and sustenance within the Center's boundaries.

Even snakes and bats, often misunderstood and feared, play crucial roles in maintaining the health of this ecosystem. Bats help control insect populations, while snakes manage rodents, all contributing to the balance and integrity of the food web.

Just as vital as the animals are the native plants that form the foundation of this ecosystem. These plants, adapted to the region's specific soil, climate, and wildlife, do more than beautify the land. Their deep roots stabilize the soil and prevent erosion. They hold water and nutrients in the earth, providing critical support for pollinators and other wildlife.

In an area where farmland and open space are rapidly vanishing beneath asphalt and concrete, the Ogden Nature Center represents something increasingly rare: continuity with the past and hope for the future. These 152 acres remain largely untouched by modern sprawl, offering a window into what this region once looked like and what it can still be if we choose to value preservation over convenience.



The Ogden Nature Center is not just a relic of the past but a statement of resistance. It stands in quiet defiance of unchecked development, reminding us that not all progress is measured in square footage and tax revenue. It was established for the public good, not for private gain, and it continues to serve as a space for education, recreation, and renewal. Children learn here, not just from books and lectures, but from direct experience by touching leaves, spotting animal tracks, and sitting quietly among trees.

A day is quickly approaching when every available acre in Ogden will be in the crosshairs of developers. There may be calls to "rethink" or "repurpose" the Center to make room for new infrastructure or housing. When that day comes, we must remember why this land was preserved in the first place. It was not an accident or a temporary convenience; it was a deliberate act of stewardship, rooted in the belief that nature has intrinsic value and that future generations deserve access to it.

Contained within the fences of the Ogden Nature Center is a vision of Ogden that is quickly disappearing. If we want our children and grandchildren to know the feel of grass beneath their feet, the scent of juniper in the air, the sound of birdsong overhead, and the hush of trees swaying in the wind, then we must protect this place with the same passion and foresight as those who first set it aside.

Because once it is gone, it cannot be rebuilt. And what we lose will be far more than just land; it will be a piece of our soul.





ARTS PROFILE

PALETTE CLUB OF OGDEN

The Palette Club of Ogden has been supporting and showcasing Ogden artists for 82 years, since 1943 when Myra Powell created the club. It is a long-standing group of artists who meet once a month to be free from typical studio isolation and to collaborate with each other. The sharing of ideas and artistic knowledge in turn helps these artists expand their skills. Since then, a gallery in Union Station has been named after the PCOO founder.

According to Tam Douglas, Vice President and Communications for PCOO, and Annette Vernon, President of PCOO, the club was flourishing before the Covid-19 pandemic. It was much larger than it is today, including a board and committees. Leadership was voted in. Since then, the group has started to regain its members. Douglas states, "Over the last year, the club has evolved dramatically as new members have volunteered in new ways, drawing upon their strengths. The club is moving toward a model of support for fellow artists, where community and inclusion are the foundation and focus." Below is a list of the current leadership positions with their names.

Exhibitions are typically billed as 'Faces, Places, and Imaginative Spaces.' In other words, the members—primarily painters—bring a variety of skills and experience. Some



members are highly skilled, while others are new to the artistic world. Douglas says, "We enjoy presenting our diverse styles, materials, and experiences and pursuing valuable opportunities to engage with art communities, connect with fellow artists, and contribute to the northern Utah arts scene." The wide range of styles and mediums allows for a broader audience to resonate and appreciate art.

Next year, the club will be kicking off with a lineup of gallery exhibitions. In January, PCOO will begin with an exclusive show at the Ramble Gallery in Bountiful. Then, in March and April, PCOO will display its commemorative show at the Union Station here in Ogden. Not only will they showcase current artists, but they would like to include club history archives as well as a possible section dedicated to Myra Powell. There is another show in June at the Eccles Community Art Center here in Ogden. Additionally, club paintings will be on display year-round at South Ogden City Hall. New art is installed every month, and PCOO is still developing its 2026 schedule.

When asked about what the main goals of PCOO is, Douglas said, "Our main goals are to help artists explore and learn new techniques, and also to give exposure to their art. We have several shows in galleries yearly." PCOO believes in highlighting their enduring legacy, community ties, and their continual commitment to camaraderie and support.

CHAMBER ORCHESTRA OF OGDEN

For Chamber Orchestra Ogden, their beginning was a small but impactful story. It all began with Mike Palumbo, who was the Director of Orchestral Studies and Professor of Viola at Weber State University for 31 years. In 2001, he started the WSU String Project, which Palumbo describes as "a program for teaching stringed instruments to children that is still in operation today." Palumbo was a member of the Ballet West Orchestra for 29 years, and he was a frequent substitute violist with the Utah Symphony Orchestra.

In the summer of 2010, Palumbo was approached and asked to get a small group together to play a concert in the park for the Farmer's Market. He did, gathering some current students and some alum, and they performed to a small but appreciative audience. After this, a few of his alums asked Palumbo to consider putting an orchestra together so that they might continue to perform. It was due to these events that Chamber Orchestra Ogden was created.

The group had its first performance in September 2011 in the Browning Theater at Union Station, thanks to the cooperation of the Executive Director Roberta Beverly. On February 27, 2016, they collaborated with Craig Bielik and



Ogden Regional Medical Center for the first of what has since become the annual Red Dress concert to celebrate American Heart Month. Later that year on October 22, Chamber Orchestra Ögden played their first concert at their new home of Peery's Egyptian Theater. The orchestra gained its 501(c)3 status on June 16, 2021. Palumbo invited people to form an Orchestra Board to help manage the growth of the group. In addition to conducting the orchestra, he also writes the majority of the grants to ensure there is money to run the orchestra and play the musicians a small amount for each service they play.

Palumbo says that Chamber Orchestra Ogden would like to tell Ogden that "We have found the Ogden City administration to be very supportive of the orchestra. 

HISTORY OF OGDEN CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

OGDEN CITY – CHRISTMAS VILLAGE AND ELECTRIC LIGHT PARADE HISTORY In 1961, I have a letter from the Chamber of Commerce (Chairman Len Allen at the time) thanking Ogden City for their assistance with the Christmas Holiday Parade.

As early as 1962, discussions were ongoing about the "Christmas Display in MISSILE Park". It was organized by the Retail Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce to develop a gigantic parade and display of animated units. The display was to be added to each year and was expected (even at that time) to receive international publicity. At that time, the retailers and industry people had raised approximately \$20,000 and the City and County had not contributed to this effort. However, discovery was made there was no power available to light the decorations in the park and operate the animated units. It required some 63,000 watts to handle the operation, including a central missile Christmas tree with three revolving colors which alone took 18,000 to 20,000 watts. In 1962, the buildings from the park were actually entries in the holiday parade; such was accomplished by them being mounted on trucks for the Christmas parade on the morning after Thanksgiving. They were then installed in the Missile Park and that evening there was to be a ceremony for the lighting of the display. There was to be a little radio station among the units from which broadcasts were made each day; it was hoped the City would achieve national publicity because it would be something new and outstanding.

In both 1972 and 1973, the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce was still in charge of the annual Christmas parade; they indicated it would travel from 21st to 27th Streets along Washington Boulevard at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. About 1972, requests from food vendors and a helium balloon vendor were made to set up booths along the parade route. These were subsequently denied.

In 1975, discussion took place between the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce and the Ogden City Council regarding the annual Christmas Parade and the possibility of moving it to after Thanksgiving. It was a highly debated topic, and the item was tabled. One week later, the Council approved the parade to be continued to be held the Saturday before Thanksgiving. Reasoning was given that if the annual Christmas parade were held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, there would be no way members of local school bands could be required to appear in the parade because the majority would be out of town with their families. At

that time, the suggestion was made by James Thompson, Supervisor of Music Ogden City Schools, for the City to give consideration to changing the nature of the parade for future years and holding a holiday parade which would call attention not only to Christmas, but to Thanksgiving as well. Great debate took place, after which a committee was established to review this annual event. This committee was comprised of retail merchants, Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce members, members of the City Council, and citizens.

In 1976, the parade still took place at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. As of 1980, the parade was conducted at 2 p.m. in the afternoon of the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The Ogden City Christmas Village Advisory Committee was created in 1983: their first meeting held on a Tuesday, September 27, 1983. Wynn Covieo was the Chairman and Lisa Hult, Vice-Chair. The Committee at that time reported they were interested in upgrading the village and making the public more aware of it; however, timing to do so was an issue that first year. They recommended at that time that the lighting of Christmas Village be coordinated with a ceremony and program. They suggested having local community groups perform; including media coverage, and having the Mayor throw the switch to light the village. The Committee also recommended the traditional Christmas parade be held later in the afternoon so the lighting of the village could be coordinated with the parade.

That same year, it was decided that the Christmas Parade would begin at 3:00 p.m. and would run south on Washington Boulevard from 22nd Street to 25th Street and then west on 25th Street to Grant Avenue. With these changes in the parade's time and route, it was able to tie into the lighting of the park ceremonies. The parade ended on 25th Street with a ribbon cutting ceremony, bands and choirs, and was done in connection with the lights being turned on.

In 1986, the Greater Downtown Ogden Association sent notice to the City Council of cancellation of the Christmas Parade in effort to spend the budget funding to update Christmas Village. By 1987, there were 43 entries in the parade; it took place the day after Thanksgiving at 4:30 p.m. with the Christmas Village Opening Gala immediately following at approximately 5:30 p.m. A Christmas Design Plan was unveiled at that time from the Business Development Department through the Downtown Ogden Association. The Plan is detailed but included lighting the trees along Washington Boulevard between 22nd and 27th Streets and various phases to achieve a seasonal difference with banners and an overall package. This included the Christmas Parade to be tied in with the lighting of all the lights and Santa Claus coming to Christmas

In 1988 and 1989, the parade was held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving at 5:00 p.m. It would appear that an annual theme for the event began around this time as well. Christmas Village had stagnated and there had not been a lot of improvements made for several years. In 2002, a new chairperson, Jo Packham, was appointed by Mayor Godfrey. Ms. Packham is

a local business owner and the past president of the Historic 25 Association. She was able to get numerous businesses involved in Christmas Village with both cash and in-kind donations. She also involved volunteer groups and organizations. The result has been the refurbishing of many of the old cottages and donation of many new cottages. The quality of the village improved tremendously. The Village has consistently added new cottages and new sponsors. Each year the Village is better than the previous.

In 2025, we now have 64 cottages.

Christmas Village and Holiday Parade It was a crisp December day in 1961. Jerry and Maxine Green and their 5-year-old son, Tommy, were standing in the most perfect spot of all for the big Christmas parade. Warmed by their growing anticipation, they eagerly looked for the parade to come. Then suddenly it began with the screaming sirens of the police cars. A big flatbed truck rushed by with Santa Claus waving to the hundreds of children who came to see him. And that was it. That was the end of the Christmas Parade. Tommy's disappointment was overwhelming and Jerry Green knew something had to be done, but what? After many sleepless hours that cold winter night, Jerry Green came up with an idea. An incredible vision! It was that of a "Christmas Village" that would have all of the toy and candy shops you would find at Santa's North Pole home as well as a really big and wonderful Santa Claus Parade. Jerry Green knew the idea was good, but he was worried about how to make it happen. The original cost estimate for this venture was a whopping \$25,000. It was with great trepidation that he approached the town merchants. The response was immediate and enthusiastic. In a matter of weeks, the merchants were out seeking pledges for the village idea. Utah Power and Light pledged to donate the electricity for the lights. Merchants donated materials and it seemed that everyone in the city was pitching in with the construction of the village. On November 23, 1962 the very first Christmas Village and Parade opened Ogden's holiday season. Those involved with the first Christmas Village hoped that it would continue on through the generations, bringing joy to all those who come to visit.

This hope is alive and well today and carried on by a dedicated Christmas Village Committee. It is their goal to continue this wonderful tradition by expanding, improving and refurbishing the winter fantasyland displays.

Our wish is that you and your families make this a wonderful part of your Christmas traditions.

THE HEAVY BUCKET BAND Southern Rock Outlaw Country

The Heavy Bucket Band: Ogden's Southern Rock Powerhouse

The Heavy Bucket Band is one of the hardest-working groups to ever plug into an Ogden stage. Nearly every weekend, you'll find them playing locally or out on the road, logging miles, stacking shows, and proving for almost two decades that their fire is far from fading. If anything, they're only hitting new strides.

Formed in 2009, the band was the brainchild of singer, songwriter, and manager Nate Cook. Influenced early on by country legends like Waylon Jennings, Sturgill Simpson, Tyler Childers, and Charlie Daniels, Nate also drew from the raw grit of Pantera, Clutch, and Corrosion of Conformity. Add in the soul of Southern Rock heroes like Lynyrd Skynyrd, Blackberry Smoke, and the Marshall Tucker Band, and you've got the DNA of The Heavy Bucket Band.

The journey started as kids under the name Retribution, battling it out in a Layton high talent show in 1991. They proudly took second place that night, but more importantly, they caught the bug. By 2009, the name had changed, the sound had grown, and The Heavy Bucket Band was officially born.

Two original members of The Heavy Bucket Band still stand alongside Nate today: Kip Pearce on bass and Harley Hartman on drums for 16 years. Later came the fiery additions of Natey Nate Larrabee on lead guitar and John Folco on saxophone. Together, this powerhouse has rocked every local bar with a stage, from Kamikaze's to Funk 'n Dive to Brewski's to Outlaw Saloon, and carried Ogden's sound to legendary outposts like Jackson Hole's Million Dollar Cowboy Bar, Lava Hot Springs' Wagon Wheel Lounge, and Jackpot's Cactus Pete's.

The Heavy Bucket Band's music is a cocktail of Southern Rock, outlaw country, blues, and hard-driving rock and roll. Outlaw country isn't Nashville polish; it's rebel heart, road dust, and stories too raw for radio. Southern rock is its electric cousin, all whiskey-soaked vocals and blues-drenched guitar riffs made for a stomping bar crowd. These roots are The Heavy Bucket Band's lifeblood, and they channel it into a sound that's both familiar and fiercely their own.

Their setlists move seamlessly between beloved covers and gritty originals, keeping dance floors packed and fans shouting for more. As Nate puts it, "Our uniqueness lies in our rigorous schedule and our ability to cohabitate for days on end, week after week, without a negative result. Regardless of our views, beliefs, or age differences, we all get along and love what we do."

What audiences don't always see is the grind. Hundreds of hours of rehearsal; endless gear repairs; voice work; new merch and posters; social media hustling; calls with venues; latenight load-outs; and long hours on the road. Touring life is tough. But when the lights hit and the crowd roars, it's all worth it.

For Nate, it's not just about the music with his band, but about the bond: "To me, it isn't only about their musical abilities but their work ethic, good attitudes, and professionalism. It's immeasurable." That attitude shows on stage, and it's why The Heavy Bucket Band has become a tradition in Ogden—a group that doesn't just play shows but connects to the very soul of the city.

A recent story proves just how deep that connection runs. After a gig in Eden, Nate's prized Godin A6 Ultra guitar slipped from his truck near the mouth of Ogden Canyon and vanished. He discovered it missing when he

arrived home in West Haven. He backtracked to no avail. Heartbroken, he turned to social media for help. Within hours, hundreds of fans and fellow musicians flooded him with support—offering their own guitars, pledging fundraisers, and sharing the post over 400 times and hundreds of comments and hearts sharing the loss and offering support in every way. In the end, the guitar found its way back in just a matter of days due to this outreach the person was able to contact Nate. The fans and friends collectively sighed with relief with Nate. It wasn't just luck, it was community.

You can catch The Heavy Bucket Band on any given weekend at Kamikaze's, Funk 'n Dive, Brewski's, Steve's Black Sabbath BBQ, Saddle Bag Saloon, Outlaw Saloon or Angry Goat. Nate also keeps the spirit of Ogden music alive by hosting the long-running Thursday open mic at Kamikaze's, mentoring new musicians the same way he was once inspired.

This is the heartbeat of American music: rough-edged, soulful, defiant, and deeply human. The Heavy Bucket Band isn't just keeping outlaw country and Southern rock alive; they're thriving on it.

So do yourself a favor: grab your boots, head to a show, and let The Heavy Bucket Band remind you what live music is meant to feel like. Magic in movement!
