
















History of Christmas VILLAGE in Ogden



In December of 1961, Jerry and Maxine Green stood outside with their 5-year-old son, Tommy, waiting for the big Christmas parade. It was cold, as Decembers in Utah often were, but the three had found the perfect spot to wait, warmed by their anticipation. They were eager to take part in Ogden's yearly tradition that marked the start of the holiday season.

At last, the parade began with a chorus of screaming police sirens. Their Doppler-effect wail from Ogden's cherished police force gave way to a big flatbed truck sporting a waving Santa Claus, followed by the abrupt end of the Christmas parade. Tommy's disappointment was evident, as most 5 year old's emotions often were, and Jerry Green knew something had to be done.

On November 23, 1962 the very first Christmas Village opened Ogden's holiday season. Utah Power & Light, Ogden's merchants and residents, and countless volunteers rallied behind Green's vision. They pledged time, materials, electricity, and effort into the village's construction

Through the 1970s and '80s, the event evolved, and often through heated, though festive, debates. In 1983, the Ogden City Christmas Village Advisory Committee was created. Their first meeting was held on Tuesday, September 27, led by Chairman Covieo and Vice-Chair Lisa Hult. They wanted to promote the Christmas Village through celebrating the lighting of the village. They suggested having local community groups perform and having the Mayor throw the switch to light the village. The Committee also recommended the traditional Christmas parade be held later in the afternoon so the lighting of the village could be coordinated with the parade. That year, the parade ended on 25th Street with a ribbon cutting ceremony, bands and choirs, and the lighting of the Christmas Village.

In 2002, Jo Packham, was appointed by Mayor Godfrey to be a new chairperson in the

Christmas Village Advisory Comittee. Ms. Packham is a local business owner and the past president of the Historic 25 Association. She was able to get numerous businesses involved in the Christmas Village spirit, resulting in refurbished cottages and new cottages alike. From her efforts and others, the quality of the village improved tremendously. Each year, Ogden's Christmas Village has consistently added new cottages and new sponsors, making this tradition better and better.

Our wish is that you and your families make this a wonderful part of your Christmas traditions. We'll see you there!





WHY SHOP LOCAL

Why Shop Local and Why it Still Matters

By the Street Ogden Team. Here at Street Ogden, our motto is proudly "Shop Local First."

Shopping local is one of the best ways to boost the local economy, encourage employment opportunities for ourselves and our neighbors, and reduce our carbon footprint. Personally, our biggest inspiration for supporting local businesses is to foster a unified, cooperative community.

We shop local to create communities that are more prosperous, connected, and generous. When we buy from independent, locally owned businesses, rather than national chains, 52% of the resulting revenue continues circulating locally (compared to 13.6% for national chains). These businesses are a vital cornerstone to keeping our community employed. They

are responsible for roughly two out of every three new jobs in the United States, adding more than 5.1 million new jobs to our economy since 2003. Buying locally supports a stable job market in Ogden and more opportunities for our residents to work within the community.

We support local to help our neighbors and the most vulnerable members of our community. These local businesses show up when it counts. In one study, 91% of the local owners surveyed reported donating money or time to schools, nonprofits, and community groups. These small shops gave 24 times more to local charities than a national chain competitor.

We eat local to make the most of our food and funds. Local produce is often picked within 24 hours of being sold. This freshness means locally grown produce tastes better, lasts longer, and has more

nutrients compared to its supermarket counterparts. Since these fruits and veggies don't need to withstand long transit times, our farmers can let the crops ripen fully in the field, picking them at their peak of flavor and nutritional value. This also minimizes the nutrient loss that begins to occur as soon as the produce is picked.

As for funds, local restaurants are the best at regional revenue recirculation (Say that three times fast)! Nearly 79% of their revenue stays in the community, compared with 30% for national chains.

With so much riding on these holiday decisions, it can feel overwhelming to try to change so many of our holiday shopping routines all at once, but a little goes a long way. A study of the Salt Lake metro area found that if residents moved just one in ten purchases from chains to local businesses, it would keep hundreds of millions of dollars in the regional economy every year.

For Ogden, that kind of shift means more open signs on 25th Street, more restaurants, better-funded public services, and a thriving network of charities.

This December, we encourage our fellow Ogden community to join us in lifting where we stand: buying one extra gift from a downtown shop, booking our holiday dinners at locally owned restaurants, and picking out Christmas décor from Ogden's talented network of local artists.

We believe that where we shop this holiday season will quietly shape what our city looks like next year, and these small but meaningful choices will preserve Ogden's status as the vibrant, welcoming hometown that make us proud to call ourselves residents.






