

## HISTORY OF OGDEN CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

OGDEN CITY – CHRISTMAS VILLAGE AND ELECTRIC LIGHT PARADE HISTORY In 1961, I have a letter from the Chamber of Commerce (Chairman Len Allen at the time) thanking Ogden City for their assistance with the Christmas Holiday Parade.

As early as 1962, discussions were ongoing about the "Christmas Display in MISSILE Park". It was organized by the Retail Merchants Division of the Chamber of Commerce to develop a gigantic parade and display of animated units. The display was to be added to each year and was expected (even at that time) to receive international publicity. At that time, the retailers and industry people had raised approximately \$20,000 and the City and County had not contributed to this effort. However, discovery was made there was no power available to light the decorations in the park and operate the animated units. It required some 63,000 watts to handle the operation, including a central missile Christmas tree with three revolving colors which alone took 18,000 to 20,000 watts. In 1962, the buildings from the park were actually entries in the holiday parade; such was accomplished by them being mounted on trucks for the Christmas parade on the morning after Thanksgiving. They were then installed in the Missile Park and that evening there was to be a ceremony for the lighting of the display. There was to be a little radio station among the units from which broadcasts were made each day: it was hoped the City would achieve national publicity because it would be something new and outstanding.

In both 1972 and 1973, the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce was still in charge of the annual Christmas parade; they indicated it would travel from 21st to 27th Streets along Washington Boulevard at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. About 1972, requests from food vendors and a helium balloon vendor were made to set up booths along the parade route. These were subsequently denied.

In 1975, discussion took place between the Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce and the Ogden City Council regarding the annual Christmas Parade and the possibility of moving it to after Thanksgiving. It was a highly debated topic, and the item was tabled. One week later, the Council approved the parade to be continued to be held the Saturday before Thanksgiving. Reasoning was given that if the annual Christmas parade were held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, there would be no way members of local school bands could be required to appear in the parade because the majority would be out of town with their families. At

that time, the suggestion was made by James Thompson, Supervisor of Music Ogden City Schools, for the City to give consideration to changing the nature of the parade for future years and holding a holiday parade which would call attention not only to Christmas, but to Thanksgiving as well. Great debate took place, after which a committee was established to review this annual event. This committee was comprised of retail merchants, Greater Ogden Chamber of Commerce members, members of the City Council, and citizens.

In 1976, the parade still took place at 10:00 a.m. on the Saturday prior to Thanksgiving. As of 1980, the parade was conducted at 2 p.m. in the afternoon of the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The Ogden City Christmas Village Advisory Committee was created in 1983: their first meeting held on a Tuesday, September 27, 1983. Wynn Covieo was the Chairman and Lisa Hult, Vice-Chair. The Committee at that time reported they were interested in upgrading the village and making the public more aware of it; however, timing to do so was an issue that first year. They recommended at that time that the lighting of Christmas Village be coordinated with a ceremony and program. They suggested having local community groups perform; including media coverage, and having the Mayor throw the switch to light the village. The Committee also recommended the traditional Christmas parade be held later in the afternoon so the lighting of the village could be coordinated with the parade.

That same year, it was decided that the Christmas Parade would begin at 3:00 p.m. and would run south on Washington Boulevard from 22nd Street to 25th Street and then west on 25th Street to Grant Avenue. With these changes in the parade's time and route, it was able to tie into the lighting of the park ceremonies. The parade ended on 25th Street with a ribbon cutting ceremony, bands and choirs, and was done in connection with the lights being turned on.

In 1986, the Greater Downtown Ogden Association sent notice to the City Council of cancellation of the Christmas Parade in effort to spend the budget funding to update Christmas Village. By 1987, there were 43 entries in the parade; it took place the day after Thanksgiving at 4:30 p.m. with the Christmas Village Opening Gala immediately following at approximately 5:30 p.m. A Christmas Design Plan was unveiled at that time from the Business Development Department through the Downtown Ogden Association. The Plan is detailed but included lighting the trees along Washington Boulevard between 22nd and 27th Streets and various phases to achieve a seasonal difference with banners and an overall package. This included the Christmas Parade to be tied in with the lighting of all the lights and Santa Claus coming to Christmas Village.

In 1988 and 1989, the parade was held on the Saturday after Thanksgiving at 5:00 p.m. It would appear that an annual theme for the event began around this time as well. Christmas Village had stagnated and there had not been a lot of improvements made for several years. In 2002, a new chairperson, Jo Packham, was appointed by Mayor Godfrey. Ms. Packham is

a local business owner and the past president of the Historic 25 Association. She was able to get numerous businesses involved in Christmas Village with both cash and in-kind donations. She also involved volunteer groups and organizations. The result has been the refurbishing of many of the old cottages and donation of many new cottages. The quality of the village improved tremendously. The Village has consistently added new cottages and new sponsors. Each year the Village is better than the previous.

In 2024, we now have 64 cottages.

Christmas Village and Holiday Parade It was a crisp December day in 1961. Jerry and Maxine Green and their 5-year-old son, Tommy, were standing in the most perfect spot of all for the big Christmas parade. Warmed by their growing anticipation, they eagerly looked for the parade to come. Then suddenly it began with the screaming sirens of the police cars. A big flatbed truck rushed by with Santa Claus waving to the hundreds of children who came to see him. And that was it. That was the end of the Christmas Parade. Tommy's disappointment was overwhelming and Jerry Green knew something had to be done, but what? After many sleepless hours that cold winter night, Jerry Green came up with an idea. An incredible vision! It was that of a "Christmas Village" that would have all of the toy and candy shops you would find at Santa's North Pole home as well as a really big and wonderful Santa Claus Parade. Jerry Green knew the idea was good, but he was worried about how to make it happen. The original cost estimate for this venture was a whopping \$25,000. It was with great trepidation that he approached the town merchants. The response was immediate and enthusiastic. In a matter of weeks, the merchants were out seeking pledges for the village idea. Utah Power and Light pledged to donate the electricity for the lights. Merchants donated materials and it seemed that everyone in the city was pitching in with the construction of the village On November 23, 1962 the very first Christmas Village and Parade opened Ogden's holiday season. Those involved with the first Christmas Village hoped that it would continue on through the generations, bringing joy to all those who come to visit.




















Everything You Need to Know about the 2024 Christmas Village and Holiday Electric Light Parade

**Christmas Village** 

will light up the downtown Ogden Municipal Gardens (353 E 25th Street) beginning November 30, 2024, after the Holiday Electric Light Parade. This annual holiday display in Ogden will feature activities and entertainment until December 23, 2024, and the cottage lights will be available to view until January 1, 2025.

The Village

Cottages sponsored and created by the community, will turn historic downtown into a nightly vision of Santa's village at the North Pole,

5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m., Sunday through Thursday, and 5:00 p.m. to Midnight on Friday and Saturday.

The theme for the Christmas Village festivities this year is "You Could Even Say It Glows", and an item is hidden in each of the cottages for visitors to find as they explore the displays. Visitors to the village can also vote for their favorite cottage at

## The Santa Run, Holiday Electric Light Parade, and Christmas Village Opening Gala:

The festivities for Christmas Village will begin November 30 with the Santa Run, then the Holiday Electric Light Parade, then the Opening Gala, and end with a firework show in the Ogden Amphitheater.

The Santa Run, a 5k run prior to the parade where all participants dress as Santa Claus, will begin at 4:30 p.m. beginning near 22nd and Washington Blvd. The Santa Runners will travel on the opposite side of traffic and run south to 28th Street and then come back to 22nd Street to finally make their jolly finish on 25th Street.

The Holiday Electric Light

Parade will promptly start at 5:30 p.m. lighting up the parade route starting on 22nd Street and heading south along Washington Boulevard to 27th Street. The Christmas Village opening ceremony begins when the parade reaches the Municipal Gardens and people gather in the amphitheater at approximately 6:30 p.m.

The Mayor of Christmas Village, Rick Lovell, will be recognized and parade awards will be given. Santa Claus will make an appearance, accompanied by the Grand Marshal of the Parade thanks to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. After they both turn on the lights that will illuminate another holiday season downtown, a fireworks show will conclude the gala.

#### **Entertainment and Activities:**

Live entertainment and activities will be featured for visitors at Christmas Village until December 23, 2024. Performances can be found on the Ogden Amphitheater stage Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Look for updates on the performance schedule online or on social media! 

Ballet has several physical and mental health benefits. Dancers will gain improved overall physical health while acquiring self-confidence, discipline, enhanced creativity, and socialization skills.

The Nutcracker, presented by Imagine Ballet Theater at Peery's Egyptian Theater will run for a total of five days and seven performances. It is about a young girl named Clara who is gifted a nutcracker for Christmas and pulled into a magical night. Lobby doors open

one hour before showtime, and house doors open 30 minutes before showtime. Door times are subject to change. Special notes for the performances mention that all sales are final, no babes in arms are allowed, and all people ages 2+ may attend. Ticket prices begin at \$18 each and increase for seating closet to the stage at \$32 each. Some dates have matinee performances for those unable to attend evening shows. ## WHY SHOP LOCAL

shop local. My favorite and most important is the sense of community that is created by supporting and getting to know local ma & pa shops. In the old, olden days all shopping was done local by merchants that were specific to the needs of the community and supplied by the community close by until trains and other transportation would bring goods into shops, but still local owners. We had a butcher, baker, candlestick maker, banker, grocer, hard-ware store, saddle maker, dress or suit clothier, and on it went with someone to handle and service all of the needs of the day. Folks would head to town for provisions once a week or month. What they didn't get at the market they would barter their goods or services with neighbors and local farms with whatever their specialty was at the time. Perhaps their garden yielded extra produce or dairy cows made surplus milk, eggs or some made honey, the list goes on and it

That is still in existence today even in these modern times as are local and unique specialty shops and markets. These now compete with big box national chains and online shopping accelerating every decade and putting many types of shops out of business. Bookstores for one took a hit by online purchasing and digital books. That charm of shopkeepers and the relationship is often ignored or overlooked. We are lucky here in Ogden to have so many shops that are original and being run and operated by the owner and staff, often family. We don't have to look too far if we just simply look and have the mentality of shopping locally. Each has their own flair and style. Some actually make their goods themselves or bring in goods from local artisans or builders. We at Street Ogden support local all the way and our theme is, "Shop Local First." You will see that in our guides, calendars and articles that introduce new local shops each season.

that there are some things only available from the big box stores such as household goods or medicines for example. But when it comes to gift giving or home decor for example there are so many local choices. Even food is being provided more and more by local and smaller markets that represent local growers. It is the same for dining. Some areas of our county are overrun by national chain restaurants or franchises. Some are really good and worth supporting. Yet, we have so many family or local owned restaurants in every type of cuisine imaginable. Ogden is known for the excellent homemade quality cooking and dining right in the heart of downtown and in our historic 25th street district. We now even have many choices for beer brewing and liquor distilling readily available. Consider to choose from local FIRST when looking for bread, honey, produce, gifts, beers, liquor, and gift and home items. So many other categories as well.

I do one trip a month to a big box store for toiletries, and other items not available in a local shop. One needs to know what is available. That is why we provide full guide lists in our quarterly magazine for shops, dining, night spots, and other services. Our calendars show the events done by local productions done by our own companies performing for our community as well as local bands and musicians all in local venues, restaurants, bars or clubs. It is more than financial yet that is a big part of it too. Shopping at local independent retailers creates more revenue for local businesses and more local jobs. Statistics show this to be true. When you support Small Business Season and Shop Local, you are supporting your neighbors and they are more likely, in turn, to keep the money you spent with them local as well (for every \$100 spent locally, \$68 of it stays local). It makes sense financially but I believe the community bonding is the most important of all. By Ron J Atencio
