LOOKING BACK

Pioneer History With a Hispanic Twist!

The 24th of July would not necessarily be what it is today had it not been for a group of explorers in 1776.

Consider the following background, the cast of characters, the historic adventure undertaken, and the results...

At the time of its founding in 1598
New Mexico was home to Pueblo
Indians and Spanish pioneers.
About 100 years later California
was founded. The desirability of
open communication between New
Mexico and California was realized
by officials in Mexico City and the
frontier colonists.

In 1775, Mexican-born
Franciscan Fray Francisco
Atanasio Dominguez was
given a mission assignment to
New Mexico.

The objective of his assignment was three-fold.

First, he was to conduct an inspection of the missions in his assigned area and report on their spiritual and economic status.



Second, he was to survey the Spanish archives of New Mexico in Santa Fe to determine their historical nature (the documents had been largely destroyed years before).

Third, he was to establish an overland route between Santa Fe, New Mexico and Monterey, California (the capital of the state at that time).

The reason for this overland route was primarily for communication purposes with economic, political, defensive, and military objectives in mind.

Dominguez was considered in one document from the time to be an optimistic man, gentle and faithful. Another reported him to be a something of a ruthless perfectionist. The two character descriptions of Dominguez seem somewhat contrary to one another. It was these reported perfectionist tendencies that would later contribute to Dominguez's' demotion. Upon completion of his inspection of the 25 Franciscan missions in New Mexico, Dominguez prepared his report and sent it to authorities in Mexico City. Though his report was initially received with sarcasm, 150 years later it was found and described as "a gold mine of information about life and society in 18th century New Mexico (it was later published). The meticulous record of the most commonplace events of everyday life makes this document uniquely valuable." Father Dominguez was truly one of the most important historians of his

Silvestre Velez de Escalante was born in Spain in 1750. Velez (Silvestre's surname) came to "New Spain" (New Mexico) while he was young and became a Franciscan at seventeen. He received his second assignment in 1774 to serve at the New Mexican village of Zuni and minister to the spiritual needs of the "Christian Indians" there.

Velez was considered "an astute observer and (a bold) writer". His reports and opinions were valued and circulated by government, ecclesiastical, and military officials to help administrate the provinces of New Mexico. While at Zuni, Velez became interested in the Hopi to the northwest. The Hopi, however, didn't share Velez's Christian interests. In 1775 Escalante was sent to the Hopi by order of the governor of New Mexico to compile a report.

The intention of the report was to determine the possibility of establishing a route to California through the Hopi territory and to conquer the Hopi people.

Velez had his own objective; to convert the "wicked infidels". Velez compiled a diary of information regarding the area trails and the affairs of the Hopi.

Because of the horror stories told by the natives, Velez decided the best way to get to Monterey was likely to be west and northwest of Hopi territory through the Yute territory to the North, thereby averting danger (the only area the Spaniards knew well at the time was east of the Colorado River as far as the Gunnison River, otherwise the area was virtually unknown to them).

In the spring of 1776 Dominguez met with Velez to discuss the prospect of an expedition to fulfill the third portion of his assignment. The decision was made to begin exploring in the summer. Dominguez ordered Velez to accompany him. He was trusted by Dominguez and reportedly was "able to attend to urgent matters."Don Bernardo Miera y Pacheco, retired militia captain and citizen of La Villa de Santa Fe was sought to accompany the two Franciscans and act as cartographer. Miera was a man with an independent nature who loved the land.

A man of diverse interests, he lived the frontier life for twenty years. He was once a captain at El Paso, serving in four campaigns against native inhabitants.

An engineer, artist, and active participant in government, it is documented that, "he lived as though each breath were his last and he threw himself into life with the urgency of a soldier going into battle."

According to one source Velez didn't seem to like Miera, feeling he was only useful as a map maker and critical of his works (Miera did, in fact, prepare maps of the regions they passed through on their expedition and his comments were said to be very interesting). The fourth member of the expedition was Muniz Andrez. Andrez had been as far as Gunnison River (with Spanish Explorer Juan Miria de Rivera). Andrez was well liked and he spoke Yute. Andrez's interests in the expedition were not unselfish, knowing that natives offered women to those they trusted, and being an opportunist he also brought items along to trade with the Indians (pots, wool, knives) for pelts. The remaining members of the party were made up of Don Joaquin Lain,citizen of La Villa de Santa Fe, Lucercion Muniz, Juan de Aguilar, and Simon Lucero (details and information about the other members of the party were sketchy). Later, a couple of runaway slaves were added to the group. As a whole the group members became familiar with one another, though not particularly friendly or trusting. The party's original plan to leave on the 4th of July was delayed due to an Indian attack earlier in June. And although Velez was ill with kidney problems (which would effect him the rest of his life), the party set out from Santa Fe, New Mexico on July 29, 1776 to establish an overland route to Monterey, carrying with it a crusader's message.

After its delayed start the team met with obstacle after obstacle. They encountered quicksand, followed trails that led nowhere, were blocked by herds of buffalo, were barricaded at times by thick

shrubs and scrub oak, and followed rivers to impassable places. Though they did find places of beauty and bounty they also found hostile conditions. Temperatures ran to extremes in both directions and water was either plentiful or almost impossible to reach; it was either too dry or too stormy. Each encounter with natives cost them supplies and their reserves began to dwindle. Having set out in summer with the expectation of reaching their destination before winter the team did not prepare for the harsh conditions they faced as the days past into weeks and weeks to months summer to fall, fall to winter. The team had strength going into their project. They researched, collected information, and enquired as much as they could. They had a reasonable and clear objective and they compiled a qualified group of individuals for the task. They were well funded and had ample supplies.

What fault could be found in their initial efforts? Having read myself about a few expeditions it seems critical, even a matter of life and death, to know when to give up an expedition and go home. Being able to read the signs seems to be the fundamental key to the mystery of knowing when to quit. Typically, delays, bad weather, diminishing supplies and illness were good indicators that a mission must be abandoned. The decision was made to abandon this mission by the casting of lots. God was consulted frequently on this expedition (Velez had to frequently ask God for patience) and His apparent wisdom was heeded. Had this group gone on they would have likely expired and all the information they gathered would have been lost with them. The team's journey was recorded from July 29, 1776, to January 3, 1777. They were in Utah from September to November and decided to abandon their mission October 11th. During the first three weeks of their expedition the explorers covered territory fairly well known, through northwestern New Mexico and the southwestern corner of Colorado. They went on northward when they reached the Gunnison River

and encountered the Sabuaganas Yutas where they added a native man to their party and employed him as a guide. They entered present day Utah on September 11th, 1776, and proceeded westward reaching the Green River (about one mile south of Dinosaur National Monument). After crossing the Green River they turned and proceeded southwest (passing present-day Roosevelt, Duchesne, Fruitland and Strawberry Reservoir). Then they headed south down Diamond Fork and on down to Spanish Fork. Here, finding the valley to be hospitable, they encountered area natives who urged them to linger. Feeling a need to press on they promised the locals they would return; however, were never able to fulfill that promise. The party went on from Utah Valley in a south/southwest direction. By this time they had spent too much time in the area and had given much of their supplies away. To survive at this point they ate buffalo and fish (later they would resort to eating their horses). They began to count the costs of continuing on, realizing that they had no news of the Spaniards in the west and they were facing snow-packed mountains. The team was already suffering from the effects of the cold and was well aware of its lagging supplies. It was at a spot between present-day Milford and Cedar City that they made the decision to return to Santa Fe, perhaps to try again the following summer. Not wanting to shake the faith of their new converts in the Utah Valley by letting them know of their inability to forge ahead in their mission, the fathers decided to return to New Mexico from the Cedar Valley. They wandered for a month (still enduring harsh conditions) seeking a place to cross the Colorado, eventually crossing three miles north of the Utah-Arizona line - "Crossing of the Fathers" - historical site. Once across they traveled south/southeast back towards the Hopi who provided them

with supplies. They went on to Zuni, and finally reached Santa Fe on January 2, 1777. The expedition was viewed as a failure by Dominguez's' superiors. Additionally, he was under review due to the nature of his critical reports of the missions prior to his leaving with the expedition. Desiring to clarify his position Dominguez headed to Mexico where he met up with his replacement. Dominguez was then assigned to serve at successive missions throughout New Mexico and northern Mexico. He died in 1805 in Sonora at the age of sixty-five, never recognized for his accomplishments.

While Dominguez went his way to Mexico, Velez was appointed by him to take his place in his absence. Velez. determined to make his brethren accountable for their conduct, which Dominguez had reported to his superiors. He also went about the task of surveying the Spanish Archives of New Mexico in Santa Fe (carrying out Dominguez's second assigned task) and wrote a history of New Mexico from 1692-1715 (published in 1865). He was then assigned to a pueblo as friar where he served faithfully and worked hard. Authorities continued to seek his reports until the day, struggling with pain and illness from his kidneys he requested permission to return to Mexico for treatment. Velez died on his way to Mexico City in April 1780.

After doing research it became apparent to me that no one person was more valuable to the 1776 expedition than any other. Though there were roughly 10 members of the expedition team, there was but one party. Dominguez, the senior official of the expedition historically has received less credit for his role in the expedition than deserved, while Velez's role seems to have earned him more credit than he was due. The journal that was presented to the governor of

New Mexico after their journey was signed by both men. The failure of the Spanish Catholics to further explore the area mapped by the expedition party and establish missions and towns worked to the advantage of the latter Mormon Pioneers who discovered Utah to be their place seventy-one years later. Had the Spaniards returned and established missions in the Utah Valley along the Wasatch Front, perhaps Spanish military forts would have sprung up and towns would have been established by merchants, traders and the families of soldiers. Institutions, religion, and Spanish culture would have flavored the area. Utah might have been another occupied portion of the Spanish empire.

Brigham Young may not have thought this was the place under those conditions.

This exploration was an expansion of knowledge. The first recorded maps of land above and west of the north border of New Spain were first recorded by Miera. Forty years later the information would be used by traders. Theirs was a mission to establish rapport, uncommon in Western American History.

The trip took 157 days on horseback, and covered 2,000 miles across challenging terrain. The Franciscans completed life's most difficult Journey leading from the unknown to the known, from ignorance to knowledge, doubt to belief in Behalf of the Light.

Underground TUNNELS of 25th

Ogden's Underworld

They were home to gamblers, drinkers and prostitutes. Opium was the drug of choice there, and people from all walks of life visited -- always in secret. They were the center of a thriving underground business and pleasure arena where the unspeakable and immoral would occur. These were places where the wealthy and poor, the law abiding and criminal, would come together to partake of a world on common ground: underground.

They were the secret tunnels of 25th Street.

But to the world above, they never existed. Some, even to this day, refute they were ever a reality. Then why do so many say they remember them? What secrets did they hold? And why are we still not talking about what happened under our city so many years ago?

25th Street already had quite a reputation as being one of the roughest, most hardened areas of the city--even in the country-with prostitution and crimes including murder.

So what could have been so much more illicit to produce such a shroud of secrecy and cover-up? Were upstanding citizens, policemen or politicians being bribed? Was it deemed a necessary evil for business during Prohibition? Did the reputation of the upper 25th Street world make it necessary to burrow underground in order for the everyday citizen to participate in the gambling and drinking so they wouldn't be associated with the rough-and-tumble street above?

Similar subterranean areas in other cities suggest these secret underworlds housed the unthinkable. Some have denied the existence of such places for upwards of 75 years or more.

Moose Jaw, Canada, is one such city. Only when part of Main Street collapsed in the 1970s, leaving a truck planted in part of the old tunnels, did city officials finally acknowledge they were indeed a reality.

The tunnels of Moose Jaw * were home to Chinese rail workers who built them as a refuge from the "yellow peril" head tax. In the early 1900s, the Chinese suffered this impossible tax due to white rail workers believing their jobs were in jeopardy because of Chinese immigration. So the Chinese workers built and lived in the tunnels, even raising their children in the rat-infested darkness.

In the 1920s, with the advent of Prohibition, the tunnels served a new purpose: bootlegging.
Gangsters, even the likes of Al Capone, frequented the tunnels, using them as a haven for gambling, drinking and other illegal activity. Politicians and law enforcement were involved just as deeply as the mobsters, helping maintain their profitability.*

Allegedly running from Union Station all the way up to the former Ben Lomond Hotel, the tun-



nels of 25th Street were supposedly similar, housing the same dens of illegal operations.

Ogden Mayor Matthew Godfrey says there are indeed some tunnels underneath 25th Street, but not in the way most people think.

"The tunnels are actually a series of vaults underneath the stores, and many of them are connected," Godfrey said. "Where the sidewalk is was actually part of the store for delivery purposes. They would take goods down there, and those were the storage areas for the shops. There were doors between the vaults and the rooms were large-the ones I've been in were about 15 to 20 feet wide, I guess-and when all the doors are open. I can see where it would look like a tunnel. As far as any rooms going across, not just up and down, under the street, we're not aware of anything like that."

As for a sophisticated underground world running under a large part of the city, that remains a mystery, and probably an urban myth. "We have public infrastructure-sewer lines, water lines—that are down 10 feet under and we've never seen anything to document traversing tunnels," the mayor continued. "The tunnels they say existed all the way from Ben Lomond Hotel to the Union Station would have to be down there pretty deep for us not to have found them."

According to an article published in the Ogden Standard-Examiner in July. 2001 (Readers' recollections of the Ogden tunnels 7/22/01), some citizens say they've been in the tunnels and saw first-hand what went on down there. Most of these people were children at the time, ages 7 to 9, and their experiences took place in the 1930s or 40s. These folks told of strange smells (possibly opium?), dirt floors, smoky rooms, Chinese men, prostitutes, gambling tables and tunnels underneath 25th Street running from what they thought could have been Ben Lomond Hotel to Union Station. Most, however, said they were unsure, as they were small children at the time.

Connecting Weber County by Light Rail

Whether we like it or not, Weber County is growing rapidly. What was once farmland and fields has become townhomes and apartments. We've all felt the growing pains. The housing shortages, increased pollution, and a rising cost of living. But the one issue that we should address before it becomes more difficult is traffic congestion.

As Weber County continues to grow, Ogden and the surrounding cities face increased traffic congestion. There are also challenges in maintaining an efficient public transportation system. To address these issues, Ogden needs to invest in a comprehensive light rail system that will connect the city to the broader region. Such a transit solution would reduce congestion, improve air quality, and provide residents with more efficient commuting options.

As the population of Weber County continues to explode, the demand for transportation infrastructure becomes more pressing. The ability to find rights-of-way for rail lines is also becoming more difficult. Traffic congestion has become a common issue, even in areas that were once more rural, like West Haven and Farr West. To avoid further strain on roadways, the county must prioritize the development of a light rail system. This will ensure that future growth is supported by sustainable infrastructure.

Light rail offers clear advantages over other transit options, such as bus rapid transit. It can carry more passengers and travel faster, helping to reduce travel times for those commuting from surrounding areas like Hooper and Farr West. Light rail also offers more capacity than adding additional lanes to congested freeways. In fact, one light rail

line can carry up to eight times more passengers than a single additional freeway lane during peak traffic times. This will ease congestion and reduce reliance on cars.

The economic benefits of light rail are also significant. Studies show that for every dollar invested in public transit, the state of Utah receives a return of \$5.11 in economic activity. By reducing traffic congestion and providing a reliable form of transportation, a light rail system would help attract businesses, stimulate local economies, and make Ogden a more attractive place to live and work.

Additionally, light rail would help alleviate downtown parking problems. It would offer residents from outlying cities convenient alternatives to driving. This would be an economic benefit to the downtown area. It would increase the foot traffic and the desirability of downtown businesses.

One Possible Vision for Light Rail

The first step in building a comprehensive light rail network in Ogden would be to convert the existing OGX bus line to light rail. It currently runs from the Frontrunner Station up 25th Street to Weber State University and McKay-Dee Hospital. In keeping with the naming conventions of Trax, this line would obviously become the purple line since it serves Weber State.

As I see it, the next step would be to develop two additional lines to extend transit access to more areas of Weber County. The first additional line would connect all three Frontrunner stations in the county, offering a more direct and streamlined route for commuters. The northern end of the line would include stops in the

Industrial Park and the forgotten Pleasant View Frontrunner station. It would travel east to North Ogden and turn south along Washington to the Ogden-Weber Technical College before linking up to the heart of the system, the Ogden Hub.

The southern portion of this line would continue along Riverdale Road. This section would provide multiple stops for shopping and would alleviate traffic on that nightmare of a road. From Riverdale, it could make a stop at the Hill Air Force Base gate before traveling to the Roy Frontrunner Station.

This line would provide access from Pleasant View to Hill Air Force Base and all stops in between. It would also grant access to the new Northrop Grumman campus outside of Hill. If successful, this line could even be extended slightly north from Roy to West Haven before cutting southwest to Hooper.

The second additional line would focus on connecting the remaining cities in the county. This line would run from Plain City in the north, through Farr West and Marriott-Slaterville. Traveling east along 12th Street (possibly connecting the Ogden Nature Center) it would link up with the first line and travel south to the Ogden Hub. After following the same route through Ogden, the lines would part ways at Riverdale Road. This new line would continue through Washington Terrace. It would provide access to Ogden Regional Medical Center, thereby providing services to both hospitals. From the hospital, it could continue east to South Ogden's commercial

Like the first line, if this becomes successful, the line could be extended southward through Uintah to the Park & Ride in South Weber. This would provide a parking location for Davis County residents wishing to travel to downtown Ogden or any other location connected by the light rail system.

Except for Ogden Valley, these two new lines could help connect all the cities of Weber County to a light rail system. (A line through Ogden Canyon to Huntsville would provide amazing opportunities for ski access but the cost would be astronomical.)

This expanded light rail network would provide fast and reliable transit options for residents throughout Weber County. It would also reduce parking and congestion issues in downtown Ogden. This will help to create more space for retail, dining, and entertainment venues and could help Ogden reclaim its glory as the crossroads of the west.

Conclusion

By investing in a comprehensive light rail system soon, Ogden can address the pressing transportation challenges of the present while positioning itself for a sustainable and connected future. Light rail would alleviate congestion, improve air quality, and create more accessible commuting options for residents. It would also have a positive economic impact by attracting businesses, increasing property values, and stimulating local development.

The time to act is now. As Weber County continues to grow, we cannot afford to wait for traffic congestion to worsen. By investing in a light rail system today, we are not only improving the quality of life for residents but also setting the foundation for a sustainable, prosperous future. Let's take the first step toward a connected, efficient, and vibrant Weber County.



CAPITAL SQUARE MIXED USE IN THE **HEART OF EAST CENTRAL OGDEN**



Capital Square Development apartments on 25th Street and Quincy are almost complete and will be ready to rent soon. It is the beginning of what will be a full building of the block between 24th street and 25th street, Quincy and Monroe Blvd. Phase one of the Capital Square mixed use development is on the southeast corner of this block. It will be a 176 unit apartment building with sixty-eight one bedroom and 108 two-bedroom apartments on the 2-acre site at 2459 Quincy. The apartment building will be a four story brownstone-type structure. City officials began planning the Capital Square development in 2015 assembling the properties on the block where a one time grocery, pharmacy and lumber yard stood serving east central for decades. It has been empty for decades as well as a blight in the heart of the neighborhood district with a mass amount of asphalt. Many ideas and proposals have been submitted for this block but only now is it becoming a reality. The block will be a mixed use project of housing, retail and office space bringing the district much needed vitality. The city rezoned the land for mixed use and adopted a concept master plan in 2022.

The East Central Community Plan considers the redevelopment of this property to be a high priority. The Planning Commission considered this rezone to be consistent with the East Central Community Plan. Below is a significant goal from the plan that would be accomplished by approving this rezone: Work to make the block between 24th and 25th and Monroe and Quincy the Neighborhood Commercial Center with appropriate design considerations.

The Redevelopment Agency is proposing to rezone the entire block (approx. 10 acres) from Expanded Scale Neighborhood Commercial (NC-2) to Mixed Use (MU). The RDA is also proposing a Project Master Plan with two different concept options. Planning Commission The Planning Commission voted to approve the rezone and master plan with a vote of 4-1. This vote was based on the consensus that the rezone is consistent with the General Plan and the East Central Community Plan. The Planning Commission recommends that master plan Concept 1 be considered because of the inclusion of a grocery store. They also recommended adopting several recommendations by planning staff to both concepts.



BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The Ogden Redevelopment Agency is requesting that the block between 24th Street, 25th Street, Monroe Avenue, and Quincy Avenue be rezoned from Neighborhood Commercial-2 (NC-2) to Mixed Use (MU). The mixed-use zone would allow a variety of residential uses (townhomes, apartments, single-family residences), commercial and office uses. Most of the property in the block is owned by the Redevelopment Agency. The proposal includes two concept plans. Concept 1 would include a grocery store, retail, office or commercial space, and 365-473 residential units including townhomes, brownstones, apartments, and condominiums. It also would include a plaza running east-west through the block, common greens, plaza and rooftop amenities, and a walkway north-south through the site. Concept 2 would be similar but excludes the grocery store and include mansion townhomes instead. It includes 360-548 total residential units. The proposal includes zoning standards for the mixed-use zone. Those standards include allowed uses and development standards applicable to the area.

In July of 1804, a cadre of French Canadian boatmen were hired by Lewis and Clark to assist in navigating the Corps of Discovery's course through the unknown passages of the Missouri River headwaters. A large, cumbersome keelboat, along with two pirogues (dugout boats) comprised the fleet by which the French Canadian steersmen, and the remaining three dozen expedition members, mostly military enlistees, would press upriver. By the time the little flotilla passed the mouth of the Platte River the French boatmen had taught the clumsy soldiers how to row, pole, paddle and tow. By late October, the Corps had reached the territory of the Mandan Indians in future North Dakota. They had covered their first 600 miles. Exhausted, they would winter with the Mandans until the river ice broke in early spring. The course that lay ahead over the Rocky Mountains to the Pacific coast was still a grueling journey of nearly 3400 miles.

Among the hired boatmen recruited by Lewis and Clark was one, Francois Rivet. Advanced in age- nearly 50, Rivet was seasoned and expertly skilled in river travel, descended from a long line of fur trade voyageurs. Nearly double the age of most expeditioners, he was impressively strong and athletic. Noting his agility and balance, while celebrating the New Year with the Mandans, it was observed, "to welcome le nouveau année (the new year) they carried the traditional La Guignolée celebration to the nearest Indian town. With soldiers playing a drum and a pipe, and Cruzette fiddling, Rivet impressed the Indian girls by dancing on his hands." An amazing display of youthful energy from Lewis and Clark's most senior expedition member!

Fast forward two decades to the Spring of 1825. Now, nearly 70 years old, Francois Rivet would find himself in future Ogden's Hole (Ogden Valley) in the company of his son in law, Peter Skene Ogden, his wife Julia and their four children, Rivet's own grand-children – Peter Jr. (, Charles (6), Cecilia (3) and Michael (1). Once again, Rivet is the senior member of another history making ex-

pedition - the large Hudson's Bay Company's Snake Country fur trapping brigade totaling more than 130 men, women and children. On the clear, warm Monday afternoon of May 16, 1825, Rivet and fellow trappers found themselves surveying for signs of beaver on the banks of the North Fork of the Ogden River near what is today the Preserve at Sheep Creek in Liberty, Utah. How do we know all of these nuanced details right down the the day of the week and the weather? It was all recounted in the journals of Peter Skene Ogden and his clerk William Kittson.

One of the great legacies of American frontier history left by the Hudson's Bay Company is their massive archive of journals and company letters. For more than three hundred years the HBC mandated by policy that company employees, particularly management, keep journals and make daily entries, whether leading cross-country brigades or manning one of some 450 forts and posts from Quebec to Vancouver. There was even a HBC post in Honolulu Hawaii!

Though mostly by way of oral histories,

layering the perspective of First Nations people over that of early HBC explorers and trail blazers, offers a fascinating glimpse into the past, right down to the detailed happenings of Ogden Valley's yesteryear's. Nothing animates the spirit and scenic beauty of a place like Ogden Valley more than the stories and impressions left by those who first observed and described those snow-capped skylines, those intertwining streams and sparkling springs, bubbling up from the valley floor. One of those early sojourners witnessing the remarkable vistas of Ogden Valley so long ago was François Rivet. Not only is it magical to picture him here, but to know he was here, gazing admirably, taking it all in,

spectacular valley home.

As early as his engagement with the Corps of Discovery in 1804, to his final days in Oregon, the amazing frontiersmen, endearingly referred to as "Old Rivet," passed at the age of 97. Francois would be the only original member of Lewis and Clark's Corp of Discovery to return and live out the rest of his days in the the territory of the Louisiana Purchase and the Pacific NW which he explored, that is, with the occasional exceptions, like side trips to places like.... Ogden's Hole. Perhaps

as we do today, commuting in and out of our

Francois's is simply and best eulogized in this way, "Absent in most records, only a passing reference in others—the mark of François Rivet's life was in its living."

Historical roadside markers will be erected locating Peter Skene Ogden's three campsites in Liberty, Eden and Huntsville between May 16 and May 25, 1825. We invite all and any Ogden Valley residents who appreciate and support this effort to donate to this bicentennial project. The cost estimate of the 'PSO Campsite' project is \$15K. WHY SHOP LOCAL



There are many reasons to shop local. My favorite and most important is the sense of community that is created by supporting and getting to know local ma & pa shops. In the old, olden days all shopping was done local by merchants that were specific to the needs of the community and supplied by the community close by until trains and other transportation would bring goods into shops, but still local owners. We had a butcher, baker, candlestick maker, banker, grocer, hardware store, saddle maker, dress or suit clothier, and on it went with someone to handle and service all of the needs of the day. Folks would head to town for provisions once a week or month. What they didn't get at the market they would barter their goods or services with neighbors and local farms with whatever their specialty was at the time. Perhaps their garden yielded extra produce or dairy cows made surplus milk, eggs or some made honey, the list goes on and it was all natural and

healthy. That is still in existence today even in these modern times as are local and unique specialty shops and markets. These now compete with big box national chains and online shopping accelerating every decade and putting many types of shops out of business. Bookstores for one took a hit by online purchasing and digital books. That charm of shopkeepers and the relationship is often ignored or overlooked. We are lucky here in Ogden to have so many shops that are original and being run and operated by the owner and staff, often family. We don't have to look too far if we just simply look and have the mentality of shopping locally. Each has their own flair and style. Some actually make their goods themselves or bring in goods from local artisans or builders. We at Street Ogden support local all the way and our theme is, "Shop Local First." You will see that in our guides, calendars and articles that introduce new local shops each season. It is evident that in

our times that there are some things only available from the big box stores such as household goods or medicines for example. But when it comes to gift giving or home decor for example there are so many local choices. Even food is being provided more and more by local and smaller markets that represent local growers. It is the same for dining. Some areas of our county are overrun by national chain restaurants or franchises. Some are really good and worth supporting. Yet, we have so many family or local owned restaurants in every type of cuisine imaginable. Ogden is known for the excellent homemade quality cooking and dining right in the heart of downtown and in our historic 25th street district. We now even have many choices for beer brewing and liquor distilling readily available. Consider to choose from local FIRST when looking for bread, honey, produce, gifts, beers, liquor, and gift and home items. So many other categories as well. I do one trip a month to

a big box store for toiletries, and other items not available in a local shop. One needs to know what is available. That is why we provide full guide lists in our quarterly magazine for shops, dining, night spots, and other services. Our calendars show the events done by local productions done by our own companies performing for our community as well as local bands and musicians all in local venues, restaurants, bars or clubs. It is more than financial yet that is a big part of it too. Shopping at local independent retailers creates more revenue for local businesses and more local jobs. Statistics show this to be true. When you support Small Business Season and Shop Local, you are supporting your neighbors and they are more likely, in turn, to keep the money you spent with them local as well (for every \$100 spent locally, \$68 of it stays local). It makes sense financially but I believe the community bonding is the most important of all. By Ron
